Case Synopsis:					

On September 7, 2023, at about 1724 hours, Star Police were dispatched to a SUICIDAL SUBJECT call at

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Police / Deputies responded to the scene and ultimately located Christoffer in an construction field near the dispatched address. Christoffer was in possession of a handgun. Star Police / Deputies believed that Christoffer had shot himself in the head and moved towards him to render medical aid. When Star Police got within 40 yards of Christoffer, he sat up and it was apparent that Christoffer did not shoot himself and was baiting Star Police / Deputies to approach him.

Star Police / Deputies continued to talk to Christoffer to get him to separate himself from the handgun and he continued to not listen to commands Star Police / Deputies was giving him. Christoffer presented the handgun to his head 2 times and on the third time the handgun raised in the direction of Star Police / Deputies as Deputy Cleveland discharged his duty rifle striking Christoffer in the chest. Christoffer dropped the handgun. Star Police / Deputies used less lethal shotgun rounds to see if Christoffer was again baiting Star Police / Deputies. Once the MEDCAT arrived on scene, Star Police / Deputies rendered medical aid on Christoffer who was ultimately turned over to Ada County Paramedics. Christoffer succumbed to his wounds while at Saint Alphonsus Regional Medical Center at about 2013 hours.

Transport:

Ada County Paramedics (M31) along with Deputy Thai transported Christoffer to Saint Alphonsus Regional Medical Center for medical care.

Hospital:

Detective Brumbaugh arrived prior to the arrival of the ambulance (M31) that transported Christoffer. Upon their arrival, Detective Brumbaugh followed them into the trauma room within St Al's Emergency Department (ED). Multiple members of the medical staff attempted life saving measures on Christoffer, but he succumbed to his injury, and was pronounced dead at 2013 hours.

First Contact:

Corporal Detective Canfield was in charge of the First Contact which was held at the Ada County Sheriff's Office. Corporal Detective Canfield worked with Detective Wirshing (BPD), Detective Shofner (BPD), Detective Wear (MPD), and Detective Pacheco (ACSO). On Body Video was recovered and downloaded by Detective Pacheco. Involved Witness and Involved Deputies had their available firearms round counted and photographed.

Synopsis of Deputy Philyaw Report:

Deputy Philyaw was requested to bring Sergeant DeBie's rifle from his patrol vehicle and bring a pair of binoculars. Deputy Philyaw joined Deputy Morehouse and Sergeant DeBie behind a concrete waist high barrier to the north of

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Christoffer's position approximately 100 yards away from him. Deputy Philyaw was advised of where Christoffer was positioned and began observing him through the binoculars.

Deputy Philyaw observed the following through the use of binoculars:

- -Christoffer seated on the ground facing their direction and sitting up against another concrete barrier.
- -Observed Christoffer pick up a handgun that had an optic on it, manipulate the slide, and what appeared to be him chamber a round into the firearm.
- -Christoffer continued manipulating the gun and pointing it at himself and putting it back down.
- -At times Christoffer position the firearm in his lap with the barrel pointed up toward his chin and look down and begin to cry.
- -At other times Christoffer picked up the gun and place it near his right temple in an angled manner toward his head.
- -It appeared that Christoffer was looking down and speaking on a phone with his left hand.
- -Christoffer reached for another object which appeared to be an alcoholic container before putting it back down.
- -Heard a single gunshot from Christoffer's direction and saw Christoffer fall to his right.
- -Christoffer was laying on his right side with his right hand under him and out of Deputy Philyaw's view.
- -Christoffer's left arm was positioned over the top of his head and could see him breathing and moving for a short time before he stopped moving. It appeared to Deputy Philyaw that Christoffer was still breathing.
- -Units moved up closer to Christoffer and requested Deputy Philyaw relocate to their position to continue observing.

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- -Deputy Philyaw moved up to the additional officers and began observing from a position of cover behind a patrol car.
- -Christoffer rolled around and laid partially on his back and buttocks and began motioning towards law enforcement and pointed at them then pointing at himself.
- -Christoffer began holding his head again and moving around and reached down toward his knees before sitting up with the gun in his hand.
- -Christoffer started looking up at the drone flying overhead and yelling at it. (could hear the drone PA system giving commands to Christoffer to drop the gun, but saw Christoffer remain noncompliant.)
- -Christoffer began manipulating the gun back and forth and switching hands, putting it down and picking it back up again. Christoffer continued manipulating the gun and changing his position, setting the firearm down on his leg with his hand resting on it, and yelling "shoot me" at law enforcement.
- -Christoffer again picked up the gun and had a positive grip on the gun with what appeared to be a thumb or finger near the trigger as he was moving it around and pointing the firearm in different directions.
- -Deputy Philyaw was unable to see if Christoffer had any visible injuries but thought he saw blood on his right arm at one point.
- -Did not see any blood or visible injuries to his head or face.
- -Christoffer pointed the gun out in front of him slightly toward the ground but in law enforcement's direction.
- -Christoffer continued to move around and manipulate the firearm before I heard a gunshot go off directly to his right.
- -Deputy Philyaw heard Deputy Cleveland advise that he had fired his weapon and heard units broadcast those

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shots had been fired by police.

- -Deputy Philyaw saw Christoffer continue to move around and could see that he was still breathing.
- -Christoffer reached toward his chest area and move around for a few moments before slumping to his left side.
- -Deputy Philyaw continued observing as the plan was formulated and a bean bag shotgun was brought to the

scene.

- -Deputy Philyaw saw three non-lethal bean bag rounds deployed toward Christoffer and saw two positively contact Christoffer in the thigh area and one high up on his shoulder and triceps area.
- -The decision was made to maintain their position until the Medcat vehicle arrived on scene so that officers could safely approach.
- -During this time, Deputy Philyaw began to see movement and saw him move his arms and head.
- -Christoffer began to move more effectively and what appeared to be attempts by him to sit up. Christoffer began continuously moving his arms and hands and his head around as officers continued giving him commands to position his hands near his head and stop moving so that aid could be rendered.
- -After the Medcat arrived on scene, Deputy Philyaw was tasked with grabbing hold of Christoffer and securing his hands as they approached him.
- -After units were close enough to grab Christoffer, Deputy Philyaw reached out and grabbed his left hand and secured it as Deputy Morehouse secured his right hand. Deputy Morehouse and Deputy Philyaw rolled Christoffer to his stomach where they placed his hands behind his back and secured him into handcuffs.

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-Medical aid was rendered to Christoffer.

-Medics moved up to their location and Deputy Philyaw assisted them in placing Christoffer onto a stretcher to be placed in the

ambulance and transported to the hospital.

-Deputy Philyaw heard Christoffer tell them to kill him and to let him die.

After Christoffer was loaded into the ambulance, Deputy Philyaw began taking photographs of the scene.

Synopsis of Deputy Hazer's Report:

Deputy Hazer arrived at the location of approximately 1802 hours.

and launched the drone () at

Deputy Hazer was directed to the subject's location by deputies already at scene. With the drone, Deputy Hazer located Christoffer in what appeared to be a construction site. Christoffer was wearing a red shirt and dark colored shorts and was laying on his side with his back against a round concrete structure.

Deputy Hazer began providing deputies at the scene with information on the subject using the camera system on the drone. Deputy Hazer also began attempting to communicate with the subject using the loudspeaker on the drone. Christoffer was motionless for approximately 10 minutes, then started moving his hands before eventually sitting up. Deputy Hazer could observe the subject yelling at officers and the drone. Deputy Hazer observed a black handgun in the subject's hands. He manipulated the gun with both hands, set the gun down on the ground multiple times, all while repeatedly pointing to his chest.

Christoffer then pointed the gun at his head with his right hand, then lowered the gun. He then pointed the gun to his head again, and then lowered the gun. He raised the gun again. At approximately 1818 hours, Deputy Hazer observed the subject's shirt move abruptly and then the subject slumped over to his left. Deputy Hazer then heard the radio broadcast that shots had been fired.

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Deputy Hazer continued providing information for the deputies at the scene until it was determined that they

could approach safely. Deputy Hazer observed the deputies contact the subject and immediately begin

providing medical aid.

Synopsis of Deputy Cox's Report:

Deputy Cox responded to get the MedCat Armor that was stored in Star to provide cover for other units as they worked through the situation. Once on scene with the MedCat, Deputy Cox drove it near where the subject was so a contact team could take him into custody, secure the firearm and begin rendering aid. Deputy Cox ran his county issued on body video during the interaction.

Autopsy:

On September 8, 2023, Detective Brumbaugh attended the Autopsy at the Ada County Coroners Office. At time of report, their is not an Autopsy report available with cause and manor.

THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF OFFICER ROGER'S DETAILED STATEMENT ABOUT THE INCIDENT

- -Sergeant DeBie was the initial officer and tried calling Christoffer but his phone went to voicemail.
- -Sergeant DeBie and Deputy Morehouse responded to the address and attempted contact.
- -No answer at the residence, but his vehicle was parked outside.
- -Sergeant DeBie asked Dispatch to ping the phone for Christoffer.
- -Dispatch advised the location of Christoffer through a call with his
- -Once the image of Christoffer's location was obtained, law enforcement attempted to locate Christoffer.
- -Sergeant DeBie could see the area to be an open field under construction.
- -While walking to the location, they got to a bridge embankment and saw Christoffer about 80 yards away from him.
- -Christoffer was seated against a cement manhole pillar. Sergeant DeBie believed that Christoffer was initially deceased based on his position.

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- -Deputy Morehouse said Christoffer was alive and moving at which time verbal communication began.
- -Sergeant DeBie requested a Drone operator to the scene to get a better vantage point.
- -Sergeant DeBie did not want to locate the bridge location due to their concealment.
- -Sergeant DeBie wanted Christoffer to come to them but it never happened.
- -Sergeant DeBie said Deputy Morehouse, Deputy Cleveland, and Deputy Philyaw were on scene initially.
- -Sergeant DeBie requested his rifle due to Christoffer not listening to commands, suicidal, owner of firearms and their location.
- -Deputy Philyaw was on binoculars and advised that Christoffer had a handgun in his possession.
- -Sergeant DeBie asked Christoffer to throw the gun away and they were there to help him.
- -Christoffer started pointing the gun at his head several times.
- -The siren was used to reset Christoffer's ODALOOP, but it was not working so they stopped.
- -Sergeant DeBie could not understand what Christoffer was saying but knew he was talking to them.
- -Sergeant DeBie heard that Christoffer was possibly on FACEBOOK at which time he requested a unit to see if he was live.
- -Christoffer put the gun to his head and discharged his weapon at which time Sergeant DeBie believed that Christoffer had shot himself.

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- -Sergeant James showed up around that time frame along with Deputy Bennett.
- -Law Enforcement decided to egress the location to render medical aid when Christoffer started moving.
- -Drone was requested to see where the gun was located and observed it was not near Christoffer.
- -Deputy Morehouse drove the patrol vehicle as they moved towards Christoffer.
- -Once they got about 40 yards away from Christoffer, he began to move more and sat up.
- -Sergeant DeBie told Christoffer to throw the gun away at which time Christoffer retrieved the gun.
- -Sergeant DeBie was in fear for his life and others and told Deputy Morehouse to exit the patrol vehicle.
- -Sergeant DeBie was set up on the left side as Deputy Cleveland and Deputy Bennet were on the other side.
- -Christoffer was yelling at law enforcement to shoot him and hitting his chest to shoot him.
- -Christoffer was holding the gun and moving it around.
- -Christoffer initially grabbed the gun by the muzzle then transitioned to a shooting grip.
- -Deputy Bennett took over verbal commands so Sergeant DeBie could focus on Christoffer.
- -Christoffer's actions with the gun and suicidal comments was a threat to Sergeant DeBie and others on scene at which time, Sergeant DeBie took his AR15 off safety.
- -Sergeant DeBie started doing checkbox things to prepare to shoot and adjusting to the hurdles he had presented in

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front of him with the vehicle position and equipment attached to the vehicle.

- -Sergeant DeBie placed his finger on the trigger at which time he was about to shoot Christoffer when he heard Deputy Cleveland shoot.
- -Christoffer dropped immediately, and the threat was gone so he did not shoot.
- -A plan was devised to contact Christoffer and render medical aid.
- -The drone was unable to locate the gun initially and the MEDCAT was requested.
- -Less Lethal was used to see if there was any movement by Christoffer. Sergeant James shot the less lethal shotgun 3 times, the first one missing low, the second glancing at his head, and the third striking his right side with no movement.
- -Sergeant DeBie was fearing that Christoffer was laying in wait still and had access to the gun.
- -Once the MEDCAT arrived, they approached Christoffer to render medical aid.
- -Christoffer was yelling "HELP" at which time law enforcement was telling Christoffer to put his hands on his head, but his arms were just flailing around.
- -Sergeant DeBie was not sure if Christoffer was medically capable of putting his hands on his head or was just not obeying commands.
- -Sergeant DeBie requested the medical kit to render medical aid on Christoffer.
- -Sergeant DeBie placed the gun onto the cement manhole cover while Christoffer was rendered aid.

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- -Deputy Bennett placed chest seals onto Christoffer.
- -Once handcuffed, EMS arrived on scene and took over Christoffer's medical aid.
- -Deputy Thai rode in the ambulance with Christoffer.
- -Sergeant DeBie then turned off his on-body video at that time and was moved away from the scene for CITF protocol.

What verbal commands did you officer or other officers give to the suspect prior to the incident? Numerous commands were given by law enforcement.

Identify number of commands, voice tone and volume used. Loud clear voice

What crimes the suspect had committed prior to use of deadly force? Obstruct and Delay, Aggravated Assault, Discharge of firearm.

Did anything make you feel threatened? Yes, his actions and not listening to commands given by law enforcement, retrieving the handgun after initially dropping it.

What thoughts did you have about your life, the life of other officers or citizens being in danger? Concerns for suspect, self, law enforcement dealing directly with suspect.

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Can you estimate the number of shots fired and location(s) of you when you fired? 1 shot by Deputy Cleveland, DeBie was located on the rear driver's side of the marked patrol unit.

Did you do anything deliberately or accidentally to alter the crime scene? If so, why? Yes, DeBie moved the firearm away from suspect while law enforcement was rendering medical aid. Sergeant DeBie placed the firearm on top of the cement man hole.

Describe the lighting and how, or if that affected this incident. Daylight, good visuals.

Describe the weather conditions and how, or if that affected this incident. Clear, sunny, warm no heat concerns for their safety.

Could the suspect have given up or stopped this incident at any time prior to use of deadly force? If so, how and when? Yes, numerous times.

Do you or your attorney have any questions? The attorney for Sergeant DeBie asked about certain items located in scene that caused him for concern and Sergeant DeBie said there was a large empty liquor bottle and at least one empty beer can. Being under the influence of alcohol their judgement could be steered to make bad choices. Sergeant DeBie was prepared to shoot at the time Deputy Cleveland shot. If Deputy Cleveland had not shot, Sergeant DeBie would have discharged his duty AR15 to stop the threat to injury or death to other officers on scene.

Clarifying points by Detective Pacheco, Sergeant DeBie said Christoffer was an immediate threat to officers and/or public and raised the gun multiple times to his head area while in communication with law enforcement. Christopher had committed a felony, Aggravated Assault towards law enforcement after pointing the gun in their direction. Christoffer was not obeying commands to surrender and/or drop the handgun. Sergeant DeBie spoke about the philosophy of Action beats Reaction and the training law enforcement obtains routinely showing the difference between Action and Reaction. Sergeant DeBie's main concern was Christoffer's safety and getting him the help before he hurt himself. The event was rapidly evolving, tense, and uncertain. Sergeant DeBie said Christoffer was an immediate threat to him and other law enforcement officers on scene.

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- -Deputy Cleveland finished up the accident so Deputy Morehouse could respond to help Sergeant DeBie.
- -Deputy Cleveland heard Deputy Morehouse advised that Christoffer's truck was in the driveway and contact was attempted at the residence.
- -Deputy Cleveland heard that calling with no answer. was tracking his location at which time, Deputy Cleveland tried
- -Deputy Cleveland cleared the accident and responded to help Sergeant DeBie.
- -As Deputy Cleveland was arriving, he observed that law enforcement was in the construction area near a concrete culvert.
- -Deputy Cleveland drove his patrol vehicle towards them.
- -Deputy Cleveland tried using his PA but it did not work.
- -Sergeant DeBie and Deputy Philyaw were communicating with Christoffer.
- -Deputy Cleveland retrieved his AR15 and met up with Sergeant DeBie.

Christoffer was not obeying commands to surrender and/or drop the handgun. Deputy Cleveland spoke about the philosophy of Action beats Reaction and the training law enforcement obtains routinely showing the difference between Action and Reaction. The event was rapidly evolving, tense, and uncertain and Christoffer was an immediate threat towards law enforcement.

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- -Deputy Philyaw was using binoculars and observing Christoffer's movements.

- -The perimeter was held at that point, and they were concerned about where the gun was and to find the gun with the use of the Drone.

Investigator assignment

On September 7th, 2023, I learned via the police radio that there was an officer involved shooting. The incident occurred in the city of Star and Christoffer Huffman was shot by Ada County Sheriff's Office Deputies during the incident.

The Ada County Critical Incident task force was activated and soon after I was assigned by Lieutenant Domeny as the lead detective at the crime scene. After responding to the scene, I met with Sergeant O'Gorman who briefed me.

This is a summary of what I learned:

•	The Ada County sheriff had responded to the scene regarding a suicidal subject: Christoffer
	Huffman.


- Christoffer had left his house located in an adjacent corner lot of and walked southeast on to the end of the street towards the construction site.
- Christoffer then walked out into the open construction area of a new neighborhood. According to Google Maps the area where the incident occurred is an extension of
- The area consisted of a large open field with dirt, rock and plants/weeds, construction equipment and open trenches.
- Sergeant O'Gorman briefed me about the original calling party,
 waiting nearby at the corner of briefly met with . Our conversation is outlined later in this report.
- I learned there was a suicide note on the refrigerator in Christoffer's home. The note was later collected as evidence.
- The rifle used during the shooting was secured within a supervisor unmarked police vehicle. The rifle was later collected as evidence and the rounds counted.
 - There was 1 round chambered and 26 rounds in the magazine.
- The crime scene tape delineated the end of the pavement on and the construction site. Approximately 100 yards southeast of the entrance is an enclosed culvert under construction. An Ada County Sheriff's Office marked patrol vehicle was parked nearby.
- On top of the culvert was a cement wall which looked to be part of a future bridge. Atop the wall was a set of binoculars and an accompanying case.
- Southwest of the culvert was where a deputy deployed less lethal rounds after the initial shooting. This was done next to a marked Ada County Sheriff's Office vehicle. Spent less lethal shell casings were marked by orange cones near the back of the vehicle and one was on the driver's seat.
- The less lethal shotgun was secured in the rear of the patrol vehicle and later photographed and a round count conducted by Sgt. O'Gorman.
 - o 2 unused shells were found with the shotgun.
- Another Ada County Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle was parked perpendicular to the one mentioned above. Near this area was an orange cone marking a spent rifle shell casing. The MedCat was parked west of this location.
- To the front of the MedCat (southwest) was the location of where the suspect was sitting. He was leaning against an exposed manhole vault.
- I saw various items from Christoffer in the area he was sitting when shot. Items included:
 - Shoes

- A black Holster
- An empty Tito's alcohol bottle
- Three (3) empty Miller Lite cans
- A phone with black case
- o A black/gray hat with an 'M' and star icon on the front
- Medical supplies
- o A large pool of blood and adjacent blood spatter.
- A black Sig Sauer P365 pistol with serial number
- Two (2) unfired bullets.


INTERVIEW WITH

- On the afternoon of the incident, received concerning text messages from Christoffer indicating he was contemplating suicide.
- obtained Christoffer's location and started heading in that direction and contacted 911 to report the situation.
- When arrived, he found law enforcement already on scene.
- I asked to email me a statement and screenshots of the text conversation he had with Christoffer which I received on the morning of September 8, 2023. These have been uploaded to the Garden City Police Department Records Management System and copied below for reference.







EVIDENCE COLLECTION

With assistance from CSI Technician Vargas, I photographed the scene including items identified as evidence. The overall area was fully dark, and photographing the scene was difficult. All photos required supplementary illumination from camera flashes, flashlights, vehicle headlights and spotlights to assist. Long exposure shots and a tripod were also required.

I shot 266 photos: IMG_0854 through IMG_1119. CSI Vargas downloaded the photos on September 8th. 2023. She uploaded the photos to the Garden City Police Department Records Management System.

Note that Images IMG_1108 through IMG_1119 show views from the deputy's perspective, both the lethal and less lethal locations. Using Sgt. O'Gorman's distance finder, it was between 80 and 87 feet from the deputies' locations to where Christoffer was sitting.

Sgt. O'Gorman cleared the gun to conduct a round count as follows:

- 8 rounds in the magazine
- 1 round in the chamber

Initial reports indicated Christoffer fired 1 shot as deputies arrived. With the 9 rounds found in the gun, 2 unspent rounds in the dirt, the spent shell casing was unaccounted for. When conducting an area search, I found the spent shell casing to the right of where Christoffer was sitting. It was partially compressed into the dirt and obscured by a weed. Later one of the three less lethal rounds were found and recovered in the weeds. We were unable to locate the others after an extensive area canvas.

Christoffer's pistol, the Deputies rifle and the less lethal shotgun were secured and collected as evidence by CSI Vargas. See CSI Vargas' report for full details and a listing of the items collected as evidence.

He had attempted to remain in, but the ankle did not heal properly, and he broke it a second time. He had a difficult time dealing with being placed in a medical rehabilitation unit, which led to significant depression.

On September 7, 2023, at approximately 2317 hrs, I submitted a preservation request to Meta Platforms, Inc (Meta) via the company's online law enforcement portal, requesting the data for that account be preserved in anticipation of legal process to obtain that video.

Investigators were able to obtain copies of the video via other methods. On September 12, 2023, at approximately 1008 hrs, using Meta's law enforcement portal, I advised Meta that the data no longer needed to be preserved.





I proceeded to place the evidence markers by each item and once Detective Rosen took photos I packaged and collected each item securing them in my evidence vehicle. We cleared the scene at approximately 2315 hours where I transported all of the evidence to the Garden City Police Department. I secured all items in the evidence room to be processed in the morning.

On Friday September 8, 2023 I arrived to work 0800 hours and immediately began processing evidence from the night before. I photographed each item then sealed them in their evidence packaging. 

Keith James and Deputies Travis Debie and Edward Bennet were identified as "involved witnesses." All four deputies were transported to the Ada County Sheriff's Office at 7200 W. Barrister. Lt. Smith asked that Det. Wirshing and I assist Garden City Det. Canfield with the first contact team.

The first contact team consisted of me, Det. Wirshing (BPD), Det. Canfield (GCPD) and Det. Pacheco (ACSO). The involved officer and involved witnesses were assigned separate areas in the Sheriff's Office and the patrol briefing room was used for first contact. Deputies Clevland, Debie, Smith and Sgt. James were escorted into the briefing room individually. Det. Canfield took photos of each deputy and conducted a round count on their firearms.

I did not collect any evidence or take any statements during this call.

Investigator assignment

On September 7th, 2023, I learned via the police radio that there was an officer involved shooting. The incident occurred in the city of Star and Christoffer Huffman was shot by Ada County Sheriff's Office Deputies during the incident.

The Ada County Critical Incident task force was activated and soon after I was assigned by Lieutenant Domeny as the lead detective at the crime scene. After responding to the scene, I met with Sergeant O'Gorman who briefed me.

This is a summary of what I learned:

- The Ada County sheriff had responded to the scene regarding a suicidal subject: Christoffer Huffman.
- Christoffer had left his house located
- Christoffer then walked out into the open construction area of a new neighborhood. According to Google Maps the area where the incident occurred is an extension of
- The area consisted of a large open field with dirt, rock and plants/weeds, construction equipment and open trenches.
- Sergeant O'Gorman briefed me about the original calling party, who was waiting nearby at the corner of party and the scene, I briefly met with Our conversation is outlined later in this report.
- I learned there was a suicide note on the refrigerator in Christoffer's home. The note was later collected as evidence.
- The rifle used during the shooting was secured within a supervisor unmarked police vehicle. The rifle was later collected as evidence and the rounds counted.
 - There was 1 round chambered and 26 rounds in the magazine.
- The crime scene tape delineated the end of the pavement on site. Approximately 100 yards southeast of the entrance is an enclosed culvert under construction. An Ada County Sheriff's Office marked patrol vehicle was parked nearby.
- On top of the culvert was a cement wall which looked to be part of a future bridge. Atop the wall was a set of binoculars and an accompanying case.
- Southwest of the culvert was where a deputy deployed less lethal rounds after the initial shooting. This was done next to a marked Ada County Sheriff's Office vehicle. Spent less lethal shell casings were marked by orange cones near the back of the vehicle and one was on the driver's seat.
- The less lethal shotgun was secured in the rear of the patrol vehicle and later photographed and a round count conducted by Sgt. O'Gorman.
 - 2 unused shells were found with the shotgun.
- Another Ada County Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle was parked perpendicular to the one
 mentioned above. Near this area was an orange cone marking a spent rifle shell casing. The
 MedCat was parked west of this location.
- To the front of the MedCat (southwest) was the location of where the suspect was sitting. He
 was leaning against an exposed manhole vault.
- I saw various items from Christoffer in the area he was sitting when shot. Items included:
 - Shoes

- A black Holster
- An empty Tito's alcohol bottle
- Three (3) empty Miller Lite cans
- A phone with black case
- A black/gray hat with an 'M' and star icon on the front
- Medical supplies
- o A large pool of blood and adjacent blood spatter.
- A black Sig Sauer P365 pistol with serial number
- Two (2) unfired bullets.



Over the last few months, I and others have noticed that Chris had changed. He went from the happy guy excited about his new home with to distant and negative. I know throughtalks we have had that there were some struggles





EVIDENCE COLLECTION

With assistance from CSI Technician Vargas, I photographed the scene including items identified as evidence. The overall area was fully dark, and photographing the scene was difficult. All photos required supplementary illumination from camera flashes, flashlights, vehicle headlights and spotlights to assist. Long exposure shots and a tripod were also required.

I shot 266 photos: IMG_0854 through IMG_1119. CSI Vargas downloaded the photos on September 8th. 2023. She uploaded the photos to the Garden City Police Department Records Management System.

Note that Images IMG_1108 through IMG_1119 show views from the deputy's perspective, both the lethal and less lethal locations. Using Sgt. O'Gorman's distance finder, it was between 80 and 87 feet from the deputies' locations to where Christoffer was sitting.

Sgt. O'Gorman cleared the gun to conduct a round count as follows:

- 8 rounds in the magazine
- 1 round in the chamber

Initial reports indicated Christoffer fired 1 shot as deputies arrived. With the 9 rounds found in the gun, 2 unspent rounds in the dirt, the spent shell casing was unaccounted for. When conducting an area search, I found the spent shell casing to the right of where Christoffer was sitting. It was partially compressed into the dirt and obscured by a weed. Later one of the three less lethal rounds were found and recovered in the weeds. We were unable to locate the others after an extensive area canvas.

Christoffer's pistol, the Deputies rifle and the less lethal shotgun were secured and collected as evidence by CSI Vargas. See CSI Vargas' report for full details and a listing of the items collected as evidence.

INITIAL RESPONSE/CONTACT:

On 9/7/2023 at 1721 hours, I was assigned by Lt. Smith to respond to the Ada County Sheriff's Office at 7200 W. Barrister in Boise to assist with a Critical Incident Task Force Investigation. I had been advised that a Star Deputy had been involved in a shooting and would be transported to the Ada County Sheriff's Office as part of the post incident investigation. I was advised that Garden City Police was lead on the investigation. Shortly after my arrival at the Sheriff's Office, I was informed that Deputy Jon Clevland was the only "involved officer." Sgt. Keith James and Deputies Travis Debie and Edward Bennet were identified as "involved witnesses." All four deputies were transported to the Ada County Sheriff's Office at 7200 W. Barrister. Lt. Smith asked that Det. Wirshing and I assist Garden City Det. Canfield with the first contact team.

The first contact team consisted of me, Det. Wirshing (BPD), Det. Canfield (GCPD) and Det. Pacheco (ACSO). The involved officer and involved witnesses were assigned separate areas in the Sheriff's Office and the patrol briefing room was used for first contact. Deputies Clevland, Debie, Smith and Sgt. James were escorted into the briefing room individually. Det. Canfield took photos of each deputy and conducted a round count on their firearms.
